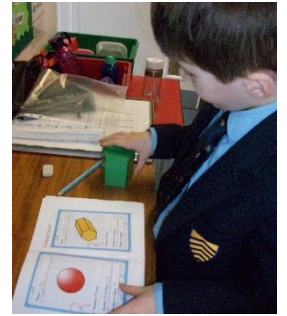


OCARINA TIME!
