### **WORLD BOOK DAY 2019 AT HCJS**

We will be celebrating World Book Day at HCJS on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March. This year's theme is 'Share a Story', so we hope that you will enter into the spirit of this at home, alongside the exciting ideas we have for school. All Year 3 to 6 children will be bringing home a 'World Book Day Big Bonanza Quiz' sheet today. All completed entries need to be returned to school on or before 7<sup>th</sup> March, with the pupil's name and class written on the back. There will be a prize given to the winner in each class (in the event of a tie, a name will be drawn out of a hat).



In Nursery and Reception, the children are being set the task at school of drawing and colouring their favourite book character on the 'Booky Bunting', which they will display on World Book Day. The Year 1 and 2 children are also being asked to 'get creative' by decorating one of the World Book Day bookmarks. Winners will be picked from all of the Nursery and Pre-Prep classes. On 7<sup>th</sup> March, all pupils will receive a £1 Book Token and a sticker, along with a poster to inspire the 'Share a Story' theme. When they bring this home, perhaps you could spend some time talking about the ways to share reading; and even have a go at some of them! At school, even the staff will be getting involved in sharing a story. The teachers have been set a challenge to read a short extract to each of the classes that they will be teaching during World Book day. The classes have got to try and guess what book the extract has come from!

## YOUTUBE SAFETY TIPS FOR PARENTS. THIS WEEK, YOUTUBE...

YouTube is by far the biggest and most popular video watching/sharing website on the internet, with over 300 hours of content being uploaded every minute.

There is a mass of excellent, family friendly content on YouTube, everything from useful tips and tricks, to educational channels, music, creative activities, cat videos, and any number of other interesting ways to waste time. But there is also much to which we would not want our children exposed to.

Without going into too much detail, things like very strong language, aggressive opinions, crude and cruel behaviour, all have their own corner on the site. YouTube does have strong restrictions on nudity and violence, but it is best to still treat it as an adult-oriented site.

Problems often arise from videos that are recommended in the watch next list. Most are fine, but it only takes a couple of clicks on wild card videos here and there to change the path of a viewer towards possibly unsuitable material.

On a Windows or Apple PC/laptop one option is to use YouTube's restricted mode (see below for how to setup). This will at least filter out a fair amount of inappropriate content, but it is not a fool-proof option. For Android and Apple iOS phones/tablets a much better choice for controlled viewing is to install and use the YouTube Kids app: <https://www.youtube.com/yt/kids/>

Allowing your children to watch videos unaccompanied is always a risk. If possible, try to have them in the same room as you, and discourage the use of headphones. The constant chatter of Peppa Pig or Rainbow Dash (a My Little Pony character) and annoying music might be irritating, but you will at least know what they are watching and hearing.

### **4 ways to set parental controls on YouTube**

1. Use YouTube Kids – a YouTube app that caters to children (only for Android and iOS devices).
2. Make a Google account to share with your child – easily monitor their activity (YouTube is owned by Google).
3. Restricted Mode – good for children on Laptops and PCs. How to enable YouTube Restricted Mode: <https://support.google.com/youtube/answer/174084?co=GENIE.Platform%3DDesktop&hl=en>
4. Third party extensions or apps – outside sources can be useful to keep your children safe on YouTube.
