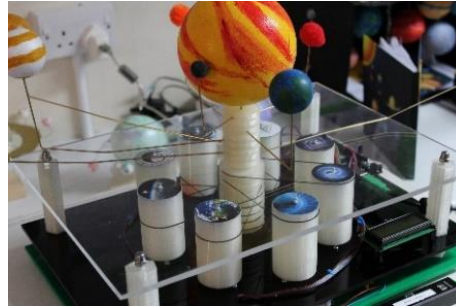
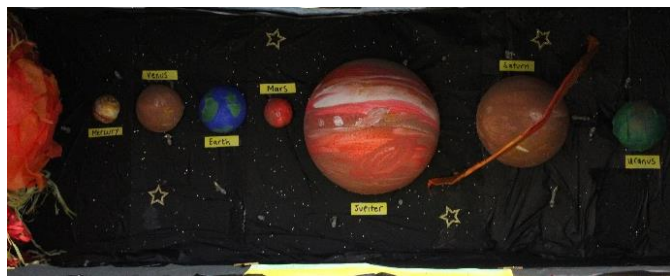
## YEAR 4 INSECT MAKING
