NHS70 SERVICE

On Tuesday evening, the Chamber Choir sang at a service in the Cathedral, to celebrate the seventieth anniversary of the foundation of the National Health Service. As well as the Chamber Choir, there were also performances from a local NHS choir, the choir from Holy Trinity Church and the Military Wives Choir. The children performed brilliantly, and enjoyed hearing about the three core principles of the NHS: first, that it should meet the needs of everyone, secondly, that it should be free at the point of delivery; and finally that it should be based on clinical need, and not on the ability to pay. The children and audience were also amazed to hear that the NHS treats 1.4 million patients every 24 hours.
