They travelled to Rome to sing at a Papal Mass in St Peter's Basilica and at the annual ecumenical concert in the Sistine Chapel, alongside the Sistine Chapel Choir. The performances went really well, and the Choir earned a standing ovation after the performance at the Sistine Chapel! Hereford Cathedral Choir are believed to be the

first Anglican Cathedral Choir to be invited by the Pope to perform at this service which celebrated the saints in front of a crowd said to be 125,000 in St Peter's Square. Well done to all of the HCJS Choristers – we are very proud of you!

In other news, soon to be ruffed choristers, Eli and Rufus, met with the Dean, Mr Bowen, Mr Wright and their parents in the Dean's garden to talk about this important event.

YEAR 2&6 TRIP TO BRISTOL ZOO

At the start of the week, Year 2 & 6 enjoyed a wonderful sunny day at Bristol Zoo. Here are their accounts of the day:

Year 2: We started in the butterfly house where the children could observe the butterflies up close. A highlight of the day were the gorillas, the youngest gorilla was very playful whilst the silverback was immensely powerful and made everyone jump when he leapt towards another gorilla thumping loudly on the glass in front of us. We found a shady spot to picnic in and later enjoyed a cooling ice lolly before heading back to the coach. We had an amazing day and Mrs Lord especially enjoyed her last school outing to Bristol Zoo with 2L.

Year 6: We attended a workshop on Adaptation and Evolution, looking at a range of different animals and trying to decide how their specific adaptations enabled them to survive in a particular habitat. This included both stuffed and live specimens, most of which the children were able to handle. We also investigated how fossil evidence provides clues to the evolution of different species over a long period of time. We also spent time exploring the Zoo and working to complete a quiz all about animals and their habitats.
