It has been an extraordinary week of success in the Junior School, both individually and as teams, representing the school. Indeed, it seems that every time I go out on the gate we have children returning with medals draped proudly around their necks!



Our U11 girls started the medal haul with success at the Herefordshire County Hockey Tournament on Saturday, winning all their games to be crowned county champions and progress to the regional finals later this month at Millfield. The weekend's success didn't end there, as our U11 boys and girls took part in the National Prep Schools' Cross Country Championships at Malvern College. All the boys and girls ran incredibly well on a demanding, undulating 2.6km course with approximately 200 other runners in each age group category. When the scores were collated Hereford Cathedral Junior School emerged as the U11 Girls Small Schools' team winners - a fantastic achievement at this national competition.

The U9 girls continued the winning theme when they played at the RGS Worcester U9 Netball Tournament on Tuesday. Having qualified comfortably from the group stages, the girls did it the hard way in the semi-finals and final, winning both games on golden goal. A great result for the girls, but not good for nerves of those parents and staff watching nervously on!

This week has also seen many of our pupils performing at the Herefordshire Festival. There have been a number of medallists and we will be featuring these in next week's Junior Times. Good luck to all our choirs in Years 3-6 who will be performing at the Festival today as well.

May I finish by thanking all the staff who have been involved in preparing for and accompanying the children at these events.

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## ASSEMBLIES THIS WEEK

On Monday Mr Debenham challenged the Pre-Prep children to guess what was concealed under a blanket on the stage. Different volunteers were able to feel different parts of the object and come to their own conclusion of what the object was. There were a variety of answers, but when revealed all the children were surprised to see a vacuum cleaner. While each of the children had made assumption from feeling the flex, plug, wheel, nozzle or the body of the vacuum, no one had a complete picture. Mr Debenham challenged the Pre-Prep children not to jump to conclusions about people on initial impressions or face value and respect each and every person for who they are and what they contribute, irrespective of race, religion, gender or age.

In assembly on Wednesday and Friday, Mr Debenham talked to the Year 5 and 6 and Year 3 and 4 pupils about different types of fruit. He sought to find out different opinions about different fruits. Some of these were familiar fruits, such as apples, bananas and kiwis, but others were more unusual such as pomegranate, physalis and dragon fruit. He asked the children to consider how they would describe unfamiliar fruit, what part of them they would eat and whether they were prepared to try them? Mr Debenham went on to compare the fruits with everyone in the room and in the wider world; while we may look different, have a different outlook on life, we are all part of God's creation. We need to have respect for others and appreciate each others' differences as well as our similarities.
